<p>BALA Johnston's Cranberry Marsh</p>	<p>Skate a 1.2 km loop around 12 acres of cranberries. With forest on one side and cranberry beds on the other, this is a one-of-a-kind experience. Stop by the waterfalls and warm up by the fire. Head back to the winery for hot mulled wine or hot cran-apple cider. Every Saturday night (weather permitting) the trail is lit with 400 tiki torches for night skating. http://cranberry.ca/Farm/cranberry-ice-trail.html</p>
<p>BARRIE Horseshoe Skating Trail</p>	<p>Lace up your skates and go for a spin on this new skating trail at Horseshoe Resort. It doesn't get any more Canadian than skating on a frozen lake during the winter, especially with the ski hill right beside you. <p>THE BLUE MOUNTAINS Woodview Mountaintop Skating</p>	<p>Sharpen your skates and cruise on our 1.1km ice skating loop while enjoying extraordinary views along the Niagara Escarpment. Ice skate rentals are available, and all skill levels are welcome. After you skate, relax with a hot chocolate while enjoying the beauty of Blue Mountain. <p>BRACEBRIDGE Memorial Park Winter Village</p>	<p>Memorial Park Winter Village in downtown Bracebridge features an ice skating rink that wraps around the park and carves in and out of Bracebridge landmarks. The Winter Village brings its own exciting take on a skating trail. <p>BRAMPTON Chinguacousy Park Skate Trail</p>	<p>Visit the outdoor skating trail at Chinguacousy Park. Designed in an irregular 'canal' shape, it features natural bends to allow skaters of all abilities to practise their skills, while maintaining a comfortable flow. Seating is also available along the trail. <p>BRAMPTON Gage Park Skating Trail</p>	<p>Brampton's skating trail at Gage Park attracts families and skating enthusiasts from Brampton and beyond. Skate through the trees of this majestic park. It's a wonderfully unique experience. <p>ETOBICOKE Colonel Samuel Smith Skating Trail</p>	<p>The city's first ice trail that expands into a figure-eight shape and covers 250 metres of pure winter fun. <p>HUNTSVILLE Arrowhead Provincial Park</p>	<p>The 1.3 km ice skating trail winds through the thick Muskoka forest and is a winter experience like no other. Weather permitting throughout the winter, Arrowhead Provincial Park hosts Fire & Ice nights at the Ice Skating Trail on select Saturday nights in January and February. http://www.ontarioparks.com/skireport/detail/arrowhead</p>
<p>LONDON Storybook Gardens</p>	<p>In the winter, Storybook Gardens features a beautiful outdoor 250 metre skating trail. The trail is refrigerated for excellent skating conditions and winds its way through the trees in the front half of the park. MINESING Hambley Skate Trail	The scenic grounds of the Simcoe County Museum is a true winter wonderland now offering a nearly 1 km long Skating Trail for visitors to explore. https://museum.simcoe.ca/about/visit
ORANGEVILLE Island Lake Conservation Area (Credit Valley Conservation)	The large bodies of water at Island Lake provide ample opportunity for skating when the conditions are right. Over 1 km of ice is cleared on the main lake, allowing you skate along a trail, instead of circles. https://cvc.ca/enjoy-the-outdoors/activities/ice-skating/
ORILLIA Fern Resort	Immerse yourself in the magical ambiance of skating through 1.5 km of wooded countryside through Ontario's Lake Country. Capture the once in a lifetime moment with wildlife scattering amongst the trees as the sun shines through their snow-covered branches as you glide peacefully along the icy path that meanders through the undisturbed natural setting. https://fernresort.com/
OTTAWA Rideau Canal	Each winter, the historic Rideau Canal, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, becomes the Rideau Canal Skateway, the world's largest skating rink. The Skateway winds its way through the heart of Ottawa, over a total length of 7.8 km, stretching from downtown to Dows Lake. http://ncc-ccn.gc.ca/rideau-canal-skateway

PENETANGUISHENE Discovery Harbour	Lace up your skates and experience the magic of skating along our unique 1.5 km Skate Trail. The historic site will come alive with amazing live outdoor entertainment. PETERBOROUGH Trent Canal	Trent Severn Waterway and the City Peterborough are pleased to offer public skating on the Canal below the Peterborough Lift Lock. PORT CARLING Hanna Park Skating Trail	With views of the Indian River, this skating trail is fun for the family. The trail is roughly 200 m in length, and there is a packed walking trail right beside it. PORT ELGIN MacGregor Point Provincial Park	Each year, weather permitting, the park plays host to a unique feature which draws in locals and day trippers: a 400 m skating trail loop through the park's forest. But that's not all. Bonfires are welcome, with campfire pits stationed at the skating loop and nearby at an adjacent hockey rink, as well as bird feeding station. http://friendsofmacgregor.org/page/winter
RICHMOND HILL Richmond Green Skate Trail	Lace up your skates and set out for an enjoyable glide through the 250 m looped trail's natural setting! The trees surrounding the trail are native to the area and many were transplanted from other areas of the park during the park's redesign. <p>SAULT STE MARIE Clergue Park Skating Trail</p>	<p>This 1 km trail is Sault Ste. Marie's newest waterfront skating path in Clergue Park. Enjoy bonfire nights on the weekends and a concession stand offering s'more kits, hot chocolate and hot apple cider. http://saultstemarie.ca/</p>
<p>SUDBURY Ramsey Lake Skating Path</p>	<p>This skating path is approximately 1.5 km long on Ramsey Lake from the Sudbury Canoe Club to Science North, with an extension to the Northern Water Sports Centre. <p>TORONTO Evergreen Brick Works</p>	<p>The Evergreen Brick Works skating rink weaves around snow-covered gardens dotted with evergreen trees. It's open-air under the exposed beams of the old roof but protected by the walls of one of the old brick factory buildings. When the sun goes down the twinkling lights come on, which adds to the atmosphere.
